

**A VERY WARM WELCOME** to all our visitors - we are delighted you have joined us for Christmas and New Year... I wish you all the greatest joys of this Season and I pray for God's abundant blessing upon you, your families, friends and those amongst whom you live and work.

**THE CHRISTMAS GOSPELS** Christmas Day, alone of all the days of the year, has four complete Masses. When it gets dark on the evening of the 24 December, we remember the Annunciation and the bare fact of

Jesus' birth. At midnight we remember the shepherds who, that night, were the first to hear the good news. At dawn we are still with the shepherds as they visit the stable. And when it is fully day, we change perspective: we see it all from the point of view of heaven, of eternity, in the gospel according to John.

CHRISTMAS I would like to take this opportunity to wish all of you and your families a very blessed and Holy Christmas. I have been your Parish Priest for over 7 years now and I would like to express my deep gratitude for the support that I have received over the years and also to thank you for your cards and good wishes. As this year draws to a close, I pray that whatever 2023 has is store for us, we will face it together as a society of faith, and as a family. As members of the Body of Christ, the Church, we are never alone and it is in the birth of the babe of Bethlehem that we find our strength and courage on our pilgrimage of life. This Christmas, for various reasons, may not be easy, but let us remember that the Lord's entry into the world that first Christmas was far from easy. The stable was a place for outcasts, the ignored, and the forgotten, the place where only the destitute would gather and yet it was precisely where the Son of God chose to be born. Please invite your family and friends to Holy Mass this Christmas. In a world that seems so uncertain and gloomy, you can give no greater gift than that of faith. But before drawing near we must prepare ourselves as well as we can with the help of his grace; and then, in company with the angels and saints, with pure heart, good conscience, and authentic faith, we may proclaim: Glory to God in the highest, and peace to his people on earth.

**APOSTOLIC NUNCIO** The Holy Father Pope Francis has appointed His Excellency, The Most Reverend Claudio Gugerotti, until now Apostolic Nuncio to Great Britain, as Prefect of the Dicastery for the Eastern Churches. **RESIGNATION OF BISHOP ROBERT BYRNE C.O.** On Monday 12 December, the Holy Father accepted the resignation of The Rt Rev Robert Byrne as Bishop of Hexham and Newcastle. In his letters to the Catholic clergy and lay faithful of the Diocese and to the Catholic Bishops of England and Wales, the Bishop Byrne said: "For some time now, I have been discerning my future and after much prayer and reflection, it is with a heavy heart that I now find the office of the Diocesan Bishop has become too great a burden and feel I can no longer serve the people of the Diocese in the way I would wish. Having undertaken this discernment process, and with due consultation with others, I indicated my wish to resign to the Holy Father and he has graciously accepted my request." Please keep Bishop Byrne in your prayers as he prepares to move to the Oxford Oratory.

**INQUIRY INTO ASSISTED SUICIDE** From the Anscombe Bioethics Centre: "The House of Commons Health and Social Care Committee has launched an Inquiry into assisted suicide, and is inviting comments from individual members of the public and interested organisations to comment. Assisted suicide presents profound dangers to public safety and the common good, and so it is crucial that as many people as possible engage with the Parliamentary Inquiry and oppose the introduction of assisted suicide into UK law. Submissions must be in by Friday 20 January 2023. The Anscombe Bioethics Centre has produced a short two-page Briefing (also attached) to help anyone interested in responding, whether as an individual or as an organisation. appointed to inherit everything and through whom he made everything there is. He is the radiant light of God's glory and the perfect copy of his nature, sustaining the universe by his powerful command; and now that he has destroyed the defilement of sin, he has gone to take his place in heaven at the right hand of divine Majesty. So he is now as far above the angels as the title which he has inherited is higher than their own name.

God has never said to any angel: You are my Son, today I have become your father; or: I will be a father to him and he a son to me. Again, when he brings the First-Born into the world, he says: Let all the angels of God worship him.
