ATTENDANCE AT HOLY MASS has seen a significant increase since the end of pandemic lockdowns. We can report a 56.6%. increase in the number of people attending Mass 2021 to 2022. This trend is likely due to a variety of factors, including a heightened sense of spiritual longing and community during a time of crisis, as well as the reopening of churches and the lifting of restrictions on public gatherings. Additionally, we continue to encourage the use of hand gel, which may have made people feel more comfortable returning to church. Overall, the increased attendance at Holy Mass is a positive sign of hope and resilience during a challenging time.
