The choice of godparents is important. A godparent is a role model for your child by living a fully Christian life, there are usually two godparents. Godparents must be at least 16yrs of age, practising Catholics and should have received the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation. Parents are responsible for instructing and forming their children in both the teaching and practice of the Catholic faith. Although Catholic schools exist to help parents in this regard, they are not a substitute for it. The best instruction that you can give your child is through commitment to the Mass. As you make this request for your child, it should also be a reality in your own life. If after reading this information you feel ready to present, your child to the Church for Baptism please see Fr Larkin after Mass for Pre-Baptism form.

MASS ATTENDANCE 2023 Mass Participation Trends

Background: Over the last few years, there has been a noticeable increase in the number of attendees at Mass. By examining the figures from 2020 to 2022 and assessing the data from the first seven months of 2023, we can forecast potential attendance for the year of 11,821 people by the end of the year.

Analysis:

1. In 2020, a total of 5,168 people attended Mass from January to December.

2. This number saw a notable increase in 2021, with 5,979 attendees, marking an increase of 15.7% compared to 2020.

3. 2022 witnessed a more substantial surge with 9,392 attendees, which is a striking 57.1% growth from 2021.

4. As of July 2023, the attendance figure is already 6,896, surpassing the whole-year attendance for both 2020 and 2021 within just seven months.

Projection for 2023

Given the data from January to July 2023, and assuming the monthly average attendance rate remains consistent for the latter half of the year, we can project the total attendance for 2023.

The average monthly attendance for 2023 thus far is approximately $\{6896\}/\{7\} = 985.14$ (rounded off to 985 attendees per month). Considering this rate for the remaining five months of 2023, the projected attendees would be 985 * 5 = 4,925. Adding this to the already accounted number of attendees in the first seven months, the total projected attendance for 2023 would be 6,896 + 4,925 = 11,821.

Conclusion: There has been a consistent growth trend in Mass attendance from 2020 to 2022. If the current pace of attendance is sustained for the rest of 2023, we can anticipate a record attendance of approximately **11,821** people by the end of the year, marking yet another substantial increase from the previous years. The driving factors for this growth would need further research, but from a number's standpoint, engagement and participation in Holy Mass are on a positive trajectory. It is good to be together...
