NOVEMBER CEMETERY SERVICES The Church has always taught us to pray for those who have gone into eternity. MASS ATTENDANCE | September 2023, Mass attendance figures stand at 8525.

The data on Mass attendance from 2020 to the partial figures for 2023 is quite encouraging and certainly offers a positive outlook. Here's a brief analysis, followed by an end-of-year projection:

Mass attendance was significantly impacted in 2020, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, which led to a drop in attendance across various social and religious gatherings. Attendance picked up in 2021 with 5979 attendees, which is an increase of approximately 15.7% over 2020.

The year 2022 stands out with a remarkable increase in attendance, with 9392 people attending Mass from January to December. This surge can be attributed to successful community outreach and engagement. As of September 2023, the Mass attendance figures stand at **8525**. Assuming the trend continues, it is quite likely that the numbers for the full year will surpass the impressive 2022 figures.

Let's consider a simple projection to estimate the end-of-year attendance for 2023. If we take the attendance from January to September (8525 people) to a full year, we get projected attendance for 2023 could potentially reach **11,400** attendees. This consistent and substantial upswing in Mass attendance from 2020 to the projected figures for 2023 is undoubtedly a positive indicator. It is indeed heartening and serves as a reinforcement to the central message: Just keep coming to Mass.

HOLY SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM A date and time for your child's Baptism can be provisionally given once you have completed the parish form and established a relationship with the parish. The choice of godparents is important. A godparent is a role model for your child by living a fully Christian life, there are usually two godparents. Godparents must be at least 16yrs of age, practising Catholics and should have received the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation. Parents are responsible for instructing and forming their children in both the teaching and practice of the Catholic faith. Although Catholic schools exist to help parents in this regard, they are not a substitute for it. The best instruction that you can give your child is through commitment to the Mass. As you make this request for your child, it should also be a reality in your own life. If after reading this information you feel ready to present, your child to the Church for Baptism please see Fr Larkin after Mass for Pre-Baptism form.
