ASH WEDNESDAY 14 February the days are slowly getting longer heralding the imminent arrival of spring, with Shrove Tuesday, Lent and Easter around the corner. The season of Lent is intrinsically linked to spring - Ash Wednesday, which marks the start of Lent in the Christian calendar, has been observed for centuries. This is a day of penance for the whole Church of the Roman Rite, to be marked by fasting and abstinence from the eating of meat. The usual Penitential Act is omitted from the beginning of Mass. After the Gospel, the ashes are blessed and distributed (RM. 234-235). I invite you to attend Mass and receive the ashes on **Wednesday 14 February in the Parish at 9-30am**.

Also, Mass at The Good Shepherd, Mytholmroyd - 12noon Ashes distributed at all Masses.

MOUNT ST JOSEPH'S CARE HOME UPDATE due to the presence of Reinforced Aerated Autoclaved Concrete (RAAC) the Little Sisters of the Poor have had to make the difficult decision to close the Mount St Joseph's Care Home in Leeds. Over the next few months all 62 residents will be found new homes and more than 90 staff face redundancy. The Little Sisters are facing unexpected costs upwards of £500,000 to keep everyone safe until all residents are re-homed. THE GARDENS OF GOD His Eminence Arthur Cardinal Roche has published recently (2023) a book called 'The Gardens of God'. The book is dedicated to his brother priests and contains reflections preached by him "to fellow priests and bishops in different parts of the world" and the book reminds us "that priests and bishops are called not only to be shepherds in God's kingdom; they are called also to be gardeners in that kingdom, their task to plant the seeds of living faith and cultivate the plot of land given to them by providence – whether that happens to be a parish or a diocese" (from the Foreword by Fr Paul Murray OP). From the very beginning of Scripture, key moments in God's plan of salvation have played out in gardens, from the Garden of Eden to the Garden of the Resurrection. In *The Gardens of God*, Cardinal Roche reflects on these gardens as images of the spiritual life. The sorrow of Gethsemane, the joy of the empty tomb, the intimacy of the enclosed garden, and the hope of paradise all speak to different moments in the journey of faith. Initially developed as retreat talks for bishops and priests, The Gardens of God will also appeal to all the faithful, inviting them to again walk with God in the garden of the soul.
