**ASH WEDNESDAY 14 February** As the days gradually lengthen, heralding the much-anticipated arrival of spring, our thoughts turn to the spiritually significant time that lies ahead in the Christian calendar. We are swiftly approaching Shrove Tuesday, followed by the solemn and reflective season of Lent, culminating in the joyous celebration of Easter.

Ash Wednesday, which falls on 14 February this year, marks the beginning of Lent. It is a day rich in tradition and spiritual significance, observed for centuries within the Church of the Roman Rite. Ash Wednesday invites us all to a collective act of penance, marked by fasting and abstinence from meat, as we embark on our Lenten journey of spiritual introspection and renewal.

In accordance with our liturgical practices, we will not include the usual Penitential Act at the beginning of the Mass on Ash Wednesday. Instead, following the Gospel reading, there will be a solemn blessing and distribution of ashes, as outlined in the Roman Missal (RM. 234-235). These ashes, a symbol of our mortality and repentance, serve as a tangible reminder of our commitment to spiritual growth and renewal during this holy season.

I cordially invite you to attend the Holy Mass and participate in the distribution of ashes, as we come together in faith and community. Our Ash Wednesday services will be held at two convenient times: At 09:30 am in our Parish.

At 12:00 noon at The Good Shepherd, Mytholmroyd.

Ashes will be distributed during both services.

This Lenten season is a valuable opportunity for us to deepen our faith, engage in meaningful reflection, and prepare our hearts for the celebration of Easter. Let us gather in unity and devotion to observe these sacred traditions. May this time of Lent bring you peace and spiritual growth.

MOUNT ST JOSEPH'S CARE HOME UPDATE due to the presence of Reinforced Aerated Autoclaved Concrete (RAAC) the Little Sisters of the Poor have had to make the difficult decision to close the Mount St Joseph's Care Home in Leeds. Over the next few months all 62 residents will be found new homes and more than 90 staff face redundancy. The Little Sisters are facing unexpected costs upwards of £500,000 to keep everyone safe until all residents are re-homed. Leviticus 13:1-2f

The Lord said to Moses and Aaron, 'If a swelling or scab or shiny spot appears on a man's skin, a case of leprosy of the skin is to be suspected. The man must be taken to Aaron, the priest, or to one of the priests who are his sons.

'The man is leprous: he is unclean. The priest must declare him unclean; he is suffering from leprosy of the head. A man infected with leprosy must wear his clothing torn and his hair disordered; he must shield his upper lip and cry, "Unclean, unclean." As long as the disease lasts he must be unclean; and therefore he must live apart: he must live outside the camp.'
