Pope Leo XIV

With joy and gratitude to God, we have a new pope: Robert Francis Prevost, who has chosen the name Leo the Fourteenth.

Pope Leo XIV was elected on the fourth ballot of the conclave, a sign of unity and clarity among the cardinal electors. He is 69 years old, born in the United States, and was created a cardinal by Pope Francis in 2023. His pastoral experience, deep theological formation, and long service to the Church have prepared him for this moment of great responsibility.

In choosing the name Leo, the new pope recalls a line of remarkable predecessors. Most notably, Saint Leo the Great, who led the Church in the fifth century with clarity and strength during a time of great turmoil. We give thanks that, through prayer and discernment, the Holy Spirit has guided the Church once again in choosing a successor to Saint Peter. As Pope Leo XIV now begins his pontificate, I invite you to join in **Prayer**: May the Lord bless our new Holy Father with wisdom, courage, and compassion. May he be a shepherd after Christ's own heart, and may his leadership renew the Church in unity and holiness.

Sunday 11 May 2025 *Liturgical Colour: White. Year: C(I).* **Readings at Mass**

First reading Acts 13:14, 43b-52

In those days: Paul and Barnabas went on from Perga and came to Antioch in Pisidia. And on the Sabbath day they went into the synagogue and sat down. Many Jews and devout converts to Judaism followed Paul and Barnabas, who, as they spoke with them, urged them to continue in the grace of God.

The next Sabbath almost the whole city gathered to hear the word of the Lord. But when the Jews saw the crowds, they were filled with jealousy and began to contradict what was spoken by Paul, reviling him. And Paul and Barnabas spoke out boldly, saying, 'It was necessary that the word of God be spoken first to you. Since you thrust it aside and judge yourselves unworthy of eternal life, behold, we are turning to the Gentiles. For so the Lord has commanded us, saying, "I have made you a light for the Gentiles, that you may bring salvation to the ends of the earth." ' And when the Gentiles heard this, they began rejoicing and glorifying the word of the Lord, and as many as were appointed to eternal life believed. And the word of the Lord was spreading throughout the whole region. But the Jews incited the devout women of high standing and the leading men of the city, stirred up persecution against Paul and Barnabas, and drove them out of their district.
