WHAT DOES "AD ORIENTEM" MEAN? You may soon hear or read the Latin phrase "ad orientem" in connection with the way the priest celebrates the Holy Mass. It means "toward the East." But this is more than just geography—it's deeply symbolic. Since the earliest centuries of the Church, Christians prayed facing the East, the direction of the rising sun, as a sign of looking toward the return of Jesus Christ, "the Sun of Righteousness" (Malachi 4:2). In the *ad orientem* posture of the Mass, the priest and people face the same direction during the central parts of the liturgy—particularly the Eucharistic Prayer—together looking toward God. This is not the priest "turning his back" on the people, but rather all of us, including the priest, turning toward the Lord.

Whatever house you enter, first say, "Peace be to this house!" And if a son of peace is there, your peace will rest upon him. But if not, it will return to you.
