"AD ORIENTEM": Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Is the priest turning his back on us?

A: Not at all. In *ad orientem*, the priest is leading the people in prayer, facing the same direction—toward God. This posture helps avoid the sense that the priest is a "performer," and reminds us that the liturgy is not directed *at us*, but *to God*.

Q: Can people still see and hear what's going on?

A: Yes! The Liturgy of the Word remains as before, and only the Eucharistic Prayer is prayed *ad orientem*. The words of the Mass remain clear and audible, and missals can help people follow with greater focus and reverence.

Q: Isn't versus populum (facing the people) the normal way now?

A: Both are legitimate. The Roman Missal allows either. The Church has never ruled out *ad orientem*, and in fact assumes it in many rubrics. It is not a question of one being "better," but of what helps the community enter more deeply into prayer.

Vanity of vanities, says the Preacher, vanity of vanities! All is vanity.

What has a man from all the toil and striving of heart with which he toils beneath the sun? For all his days are full of sorrow, and his work is a vexation. Even in the night his heart does not rest. Second reading Colossians 3:1-5, 9-11

Brothers and Sisters: If you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth. For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ who is your life appears, then you also will appear with him in glory. Put to death, therefore, what is earthly in you: sexual immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry. Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have put off the old self with its practices and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge after the image of its creator. Here there is not Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave, free; but Christ is all, and in all.

Gospel Luke 12:13-21

At that time: Someone in the crowd said to Jesus, 'Teacher, tell my brother to divide the inheritance with me.' But he said to him, 'Man, who made me a judge or arbitrator over you?' And he said to them, 'Take care, and be on your guard against all covetousness, for one's life does not consist in the abundance of one's possessions.' This night your soul is required of you, and the things you have prepared, whose will they be?" So is the one who lays up treasure for himself, and is not rich towards God.'
